

Alexander Muñoz Godoy

Alexander Muñoz Godoy, a Chilean classical guitarist born in 1996 in Santiago, has developed a distinguished artistic career with international projection. He began his musical studies at the age of 16 at the Universidad de Chile, where he studied under professors Ernesto Quezada and Miguel Álvarez. He earned a Bachelor's degree in Arts with a major in Musical Performance, specializing in Classical Guitar.

Later, he moved to Germany to continue his training at the Hochschule für Musik Franz Liszt in Weimar, studying under renowned maestro Ricardo Gallén as part of a Master's program in Music, which he completed in 2025. He is currently pursuing a Konzertexamen at the same institution, with a specialization in chamber music.

He has been awarded five scholarships in support of his academic and artistic development, including the prestigious Charlotte Krupp Stipendium granted by the Neue Liszt Stiftung and the continued support of the Fundación Guitarra Viva Ernesto Quezada. His career includes participation in thirteen national and international competitions, winning multiple prizes, including first places in Argentina, Bulgaria, Panama, and Bolivia.

He has also recorded contemporary works by Latin American composers and has performed as a soloist and chamber musician on important stages in Italy, Germany, Bulgaria, Spain, Argentina, Panama, Bolivia, and Chile.
